You did well identifying risks today, Progressing to Sl 2-7



This term in RSHE, students have been working very hard to master their SIs and gain lots of points! The Bobcats have been recognising differences between people, for example cultural and religious differences; identifying things that are fair and unfair; learning about basic human rights; identifying risks, whilst learning some important first aid techniques.

The Cougars have learnt about fundamental shared values and democracy; the importance of mental and physical health and wellbeing; and have begun to put into practice some first aid skills they have learnt.

The Tigers and Lynx have been learning about fundamental shared values; discussing pressure groups and protest, as well as the role of trade unions; identifying emotions and coping strategies; and have begun to learn about the role of the media and some rules regarding censorship.

The Leopards have revisited their prior learning on growing up, puberty and relationships; discussed protests; and learnt about the importance of mental and physical health and wellbeing.

The year 11s sat their GCSE in Citizenship this term and have left with their heads held high – well done, all!

Across school we have continued with the push to development of vocabulary by teaching “Words of the week” (these are key curriculum specific words) and celebrating the use of good vocabulary with “word power awards”.

It has been proven that having a large vocabulary improves your chances of doing well in exams and getting a better job later in life. This term every students’ vocabulary skills were re-assessed; in one year the average vocabulary age increased from 10 year 5 months to 11 years 9 months, Bret demonstrated the most progress with his vocabulary age equivalent increasing by 3 years 4 months (in a year).

Reading is a great way to develop your vocabulary, see if you can read at least one book in the holiday and also have a go at the summer word search (prize for the first person to complete it!

This term we have all been busy collecting oracy superstar stickers. These are awarded for different oracy targets over the term. For the last two weeks we have been given stickers when we acknowledge that we don’t understand and ask for support. This is not as easy as it sounds and requires confidence and resilience.

Josh Romeo won the “oracy award” this term for collecting the most stickers.

Sadly, we have had to say goodbye to our Year 11 students who completed their GCSE English Language in June. Thank you for trying your best until the very end.

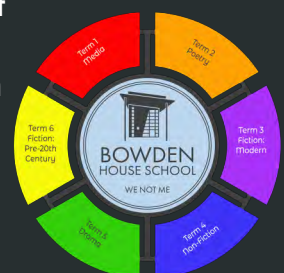

Any cooking at home, please share pictures with us, it may count towards some SI stickers in their books. Especially if they share their food at home.

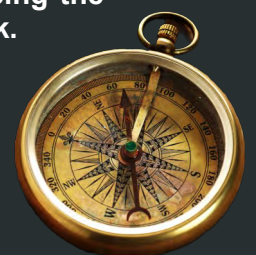

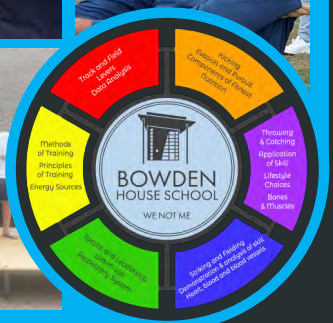
The Student's Student Award.

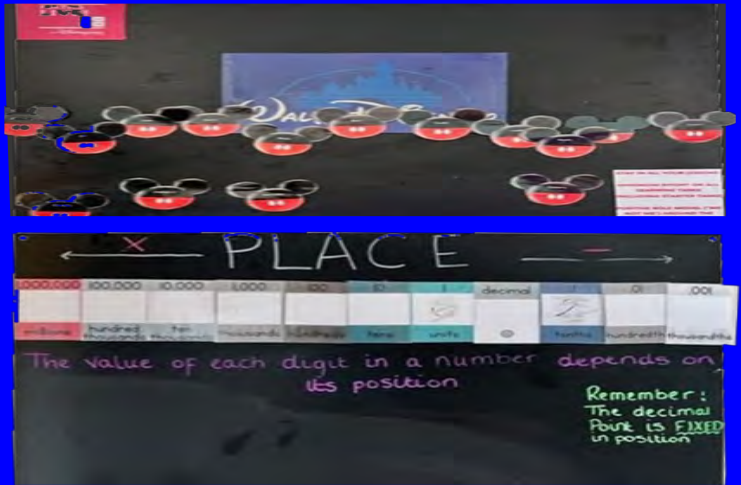
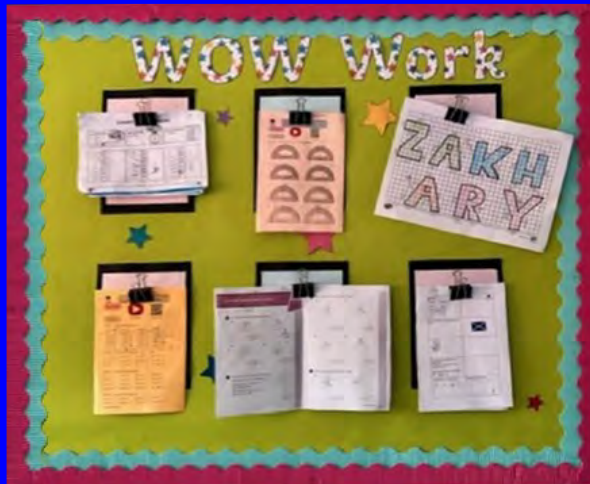

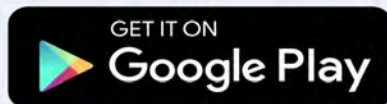
